WINE LIST & TASTING NOTES

My husband is very picky about his wines and I help with tasting - of course I am in charge of making sure there is no wastage - especially the White wine !!! One of my husbands all time favourite wineries has been St Halletts - He tells me that the St Hallett winemaking philosophy is simple but amazing with their attention to detail. He has now introduced their Barossa Valley Rose. They are our favourite wines and we hope enjoy them as much as we do !!!

Champagne, Sparkling and White Wines

Tatachilla Brut NV - Glass - \$ 10 / Bottle - \$ 40

Established in 1903, Tatachilla is a McLaren Vale stalwart, producing wines of regional distinction sourced from premium vineyards. This sparkling wine is pale straw in colour with a bouquet of delicate floral and fruity notes. Juicy strawberry and apple flavours with a hint of citrus and a nutty finish.

Houghton WA Reserve Chardonnay - Glass - \$ 12 / Bottle - \$ 45

The palate mirrors the bouquet with fresh and full flavoured stone fruit and citrus characters. It does have a hint of hazelnut and vanilla that I am told is derived from extended yeast lees contact and the oak maturation. I was also told that It has the potential to cellar for up to 3years - with Boo around that is definitely not a possibility !!

Petaluma Adelaide Hills White Label Chardonnay - Bottle - \$ 50

Petaluma White Label wines are exceptional cool climate wines with grapes from two vineyards at Lenswood and Balhannah in Adelaide Hills. The wine is fermented in French oak Barrriques and stainless steel tanks. The wine has classic citrus character, good acid and mineral fruit, with hints of peach combined with subtle oak.

Mud House Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc - Glass - \$ 11 / Bottle - \$ 45

This is the Sub Region series from Mud House from the end of Rapuara Road. While it has a balanced and quenching finish, the bouquet is full of good grapefruit and passionfruit. Just an additional note - Mud House is part of New Zealand's Sustainable Winegrowing since 2001.

Mud House Marlborough Pinot Gris - Glass - \$ 11 / Bottle - \$ 45

Another Mud House Sub Region wine series but this time from Grovetown. This Pinot Gris has a great Red Apple, Quince bouquet driving a fruit driven long spicy finish. Growing up in Marlborough instilled Cleighen, the Mud House winemaker with a desire satisfied by vines and wine – it also helps that he enjoys drinking it !!!

Rolf Binder Eden Valley Riesling - Glass - \$ 11 / Bottle - \$ 45

Eden Valley is in the Barossa with its Rieslings prized for their vibrancy and longevity producing many of Australia's great Rieslings. The fruit for this Riesling is sourced from four distinct blocks in two Eden Valley vineyards resulting in a delightfully aromatic, with good acidity with vibrant lemon/lime citrus and Fuji apple flavours.



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We have retained our favorite Barossa Valley wines from the St Halletts and the ever so popular cool climate classic Pinot Noir from Mornington Peninsula. However, we have introduced my husbands favorite wines from Tatchilla that was established in 1903 and is a McLaren Vale stalwart, producing wines of distinction. We have also introduced a Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon from Houghton, one of the oldest and most awarded Australian wineries.

Red Wines & Rose

St Hallett Barossa Valley Rosé – Glass – \$ 11 / Bottle – \$ 45

The Barossa Valley is the ideal home for producing the fresh red fruit characters that make Grenache a standout variety for delicious Rose. This has a luscious bouquet of fresh strawberries, white stone fruit and summer blossoms with a vibrant abundance of fresh strawberries and cream> It has a clean cut acidity with a savuory hint.

Red Hill Estate Cool Climate Pinot Noir – Bottle – \$ 45

Although Australia is known for its darker wines, it is starting to produce high- quality Pinot Noir in its cooler regions with some consistency. This cool climate classic Mornington Peninsula Pinot Noir shows the familiar perfume and elegance with flavours of liqueur cherries, spice, silky tannins and a hint of oak.

St Hallett Gamekeepers Barossa Shiraz – Glass – \$ 11 / Bottle – \$ 45

St Hallett and Shiraz goes hand in hand when you start talking about the Barossa. The Gamekeeper's Shiraz displays lifted and pretty notes of lively purple fruit characters with a delicate hint of violets. Pure red fruits dominate on the palate, with lifted spices of cinnamon.

Petaluma White Label Coonawarra Shiraz – Bottle – \$ 50

The grapes are grown in the key regions of Adelaide Hills and Coonawarra. This Shiraz is a medium bodied, bright and vibrant wine with red berry fruit aromas. This flows onto the plate with an abundance of soft silky tannins and a classic earthiness typical of the region. Great with lamb shanks and hearty curries.

Houghton WA Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon – Glass – \$ 12 / Bottle – \$ 45

Founded in 1836 by three British Army Officers, named after the most senior, Houghton is one of Australia's oldest and most awarded wineries. From their reserve range, this is a medium bodied wine with upfront flavours of cassis, black olive and blackberry combined with mocha. It has supple and soft tannins leading to a lovely, savoury finish.

Tatchilla 'Drops on Tide' McLaren Vale Cabernet Sauvignon – Bottle – \$ 50

This collection is created using fruit solely from McLaren Vale fittingly telling stories of the coastal wine region: rain drops on the tide at the end of a winters day and the pale "moons" rising on Maslin Beach. This is a smooth and velvety Cabernet bursting with fruit flavours; cassis, mint and spice with a soft textural tannin.
